# Agenda Item E. Selection of Vendor for Medalie Roadside Park Livery-Light Concession Services

**Background:** To give patrons enhanced recreational access to the Boardman Lake and Boardman River and to increase revenue generated for Parks and Recreation, the Parks and Recreation Commission directed the Director to issue a request for proposals for services to be provided at Medalie Roadside Park during the summer season. The proposal asked for a vendor to provide:

- kayak rentals
- bike rentals
- standup paddleboard rentals (SUPs)
- "shuttle" service to other locations
- minimal concession sales such as water, sports drinks, snacks, with the possibility for expanding concessions products, to be approved by Director of the Parks and Recreation Department before sales commence

Three proposals were submitted in response to that request prior to the deadline on April 3, 2017, from Paddle TC, TC Ale Trail, and River Outfitters. The Business Development Team (BDT) of the Parks and Recreation Commission met twice to review the proposals so that it could make a recommendation to the full commission about vendor selection. During its special meeting on Tuesday, April 25, the BDT recommended selecting River Outfitters as the vendor to provide livery and concession services at Medalie Park. The Director made that recommendation on behalf of the BDT to the full Parks Board during its regular meeting on May 11. During that meeting, the Parks Board voted to table the item, then three commissioners requested, in writing, to hold a special meeting to select the vendor to provide livery and concession services at Medalie Roadside Park.

**Instructions:** As a reminder, a decision about selecting a vendor to provide services at Medalie Park must only be based on the criteria established in the request for proposals. In preparation for the May 18 special meeting, please:

- 1. review and rate each vendor's proposal, using the corresponding rating sheet
- 2. total all of the points for each vendor, and include that total in answer to Question 6 on the rating sheet
- 3. bring your rating sheets to the meeting, where they will be collected by the Director at the close of the meeting.

# Services Being Sought (One Year; Multi-Year Will Be Considered)

Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation is seeking proposals from vendors to provide the following recreational and concession services to the public at Medalie Roadside Park, at 1910 W. South Airport Road in Traverse City:

- kayak rentals
- bike rentals
- standup paddleboard rentals (SUPs)
- "shuttle" service to other locations
- minimal concession sales such as water, sports drinks, snacks, with the possibility for expanding concessions products, to be approved by Director of the Parks and Recreation Department before sales commence

# **Why Services Are Being Sought**

Services are being sought to:

- give patrons enhanced recreational access to the Boardman Lake and Boardman River
- to increase revenue generated for Parks and Recreation through a rental agreement with vendor

# **About Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation-Senior Center Network**

The Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation-Senior Center Network Department serves its community through recreational opportunities at its many diverse parks and senior center locations. The department, with the County Parks and Recreation Commission, oversees and acts as the steward for ten properties:

- Beitner Park
- the 45-acre Civic Center building and grounds, including Easling Pool and Howe Arena
- the Keystone Soccer Complex and Birmley Property
- Medalie Park
- Maple Bay Park and Natural Area
- Meyer Property
- Nature Education Reserve
- Power and Bassett Islands
- Twin Lakes Park
- VASA Trailhead

#### **About Medalie Roadside Park**

Medalie Roadside Park is a 15-acre public park, featuring a picnic shelter, indoor restrooms, a paved walking path, three overlooks/platforms, and a canoe launch site. The park is located on the south shore of the Boardman Lake, along the Boardman River, and is intersected by the TART Trail.

#### **Vendor Requirements**

# Evaluation

At the end of the contract term:

- a. provide the Parks and Recreation Commission with a written report of operations at Medalie Roadside Park, including number of participants served, items sold, and level of customer satisfaction with services being provided
- b. meet with the Parks and Recreation Department Director to discuss operations at Medalie Roadside Park

# Facilities, Equipment, Expectations

Use signage to be approved by Parks and Recreation Director at the entrance of the park within 50 feet of park sign, compliant with local ordinances.

A trailer or shelter may be used on property, if approved by the Grand Traverse County Facilities Management and Parks and Recreation Director.

Use canoe launch and the inlet/outlet to the immediate south of launch to launch canoes, kayaks, and standup paddle boards.

Be mindful of and monitor launch area for signs of erosion and immediately report such to the Parks and Recreation Director.

Be solely responsible for all equipment used in providing the services previously described.

#### Assumption of Risk and Insurance

Assume all risk in performing work and services, and be solely responsible for any and all damages arising out of injuries to persons or property.

Maintain, at own expense, liability insurance coverage for all operations, products, use, and/or occupancy of the property, covering all aspects of personal liability, bodily injury, property damage, and death. Minimum limit of liability is \$2,000,000 per occurrence, and aggregate.

Provide satisfactory certificates of all insurance policies to the Parks and Recreation Commission prior to commencing any use or occupancy of the Premises.

Provide proof of Workman's Compensation Insurance for all employees. All employees who work at Medalie Roadside Park must be at least 16 years of age. All employees must be CPR-First-aid Certified.

# Non-exclusivity

Parks and Recreation cannot guarantee exclusive rights to sell concessions on the Medalie Roadside Park property. Director will do his/her best to have any group or vendor with permission to sell food meet with chosen vendor to provide livery services to make any dual sales be as compatible as possible. Any

group/vendor wishing to set up food concessions of any type as part of an event will be directed to meet with the primary vendor (the vendor selected through this request for proposal process to provide services at Medalie Park) and the Parks Director within thirty (30) days in advance of event to make a formal request and proposal. Director is authorized to approve/decline such a request.

Three written references/testimonials from other organizations that have used vendor's services.

# **Requirements for Proposal Preparation**

The proposal submission will include:

- 1. letter of intent explaining why you would like to be awarded the contract and what you will bring as the primary vendor
- 2. organizational structure, indicating the CEO, COO, CFO, history/background of service, qualifications to provide services
- 3. proposal with a complete description of services to be provided, hours of operation, staffing, time frames, costs
- 4. proposed rental fee per season to rent the space at the park
- 5. description of how an end-of-season evaluation and operations report will be provided
- 6. proposed term of agreement (such as one year; one-year, renewable, subject to negotiation; or multi-year)
- 7. three testimonial statements from previous clients using your services
- 8. proof of insurance, as stated above

#### **Contract and Award Process and Criteria**

Proposals will be evaluated and reviewed by a panel of Grand Traverse County staff, based upon the criteria required in this RFP and how well the response to the criteria meet or exceed the services required.



It is with great pleasure that we write to you today regarding business operations at Medalie Roadside Park. We intend to provide a new burst of activity at the park and to continue our proven track record of outstanding service to tourists and locals alike.

The River Outfitters of Traverse City is Northern Michigan's original Kayak, Bike, and SUP rental service. From our beginnings in Glen Arbor, on the banks of the gorgeous Crystal River, we've provided the best and safest recreation the region has to offer. In 2009, The River assumed rental and food services at the old zoo at Clinch Park. Upon renovations of the park, The River retained five accident-free years as the center of the most popular beach in the area, bringing a family-centered approach to our business. Now, under new organizational structure, we continue to operate from the warehouse at 221 Grandview Parkway, providing the best quality service on the Boardman. We believe that a location upstream would provide even better access to the parts of the river so often forgotten by downtown businesses, so often overlooked as valuable to our natural resources and economy as a whole.

With a Medalie Park operations hub, the higher reaches of the wild river become open to the enjoyment and protection of all. As the primary vendor, we will bring our many years of flawless, accident-free experience, a well-known and internet-optimized name to an important county park, and a lasting, mutually beneficial partnership with Grand Traverse County. Our increased business is an asset to the ground on which it's located; we believe we can have a big part in reviving the Logan's Landing area. Thus, we can bring better awareness to all County parks, and share some of what makes this area special with a broader audience.

Our business is structured as an S Corporation, with Mr. Fisher Sutherland as the CEO. Our financials are managed by Mr. Lloyd Philips, an accomplished CPA and financial advisor. Operations are managed by Mr. Mike Sutherland, the founder of the company, as well as by our returning seasonal employees.

At Medalie Park, we will offer the same great services as downtown:

- Hourly Bike rental, for the enjoyment of the new Boardman Lake Trail.
- Hourly Kayak and SUP rental, for the exploration of the backwaters of Logan's Landing and the delta of Boardman Lake.
- Half-day rentals for extended excursions on the Natural Education Reserve trails, into downtown and North up the Leelanau Trail.
- Full-day and weekly rentals for vacationers and locals.
- River trips, guided brewery tours, and up-and-back bike/kayak trips will also be mainstays of The River South.

We propose a staffed "hut" on the property, with at least one employee present from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm, seven days per week. We firmly believe in consistency; having a host at the site is vitally important to our goals. In the "shoulder-seasons", we will offer trips and rentals on an on-call basis, with our travel time to Medalie from downtown in less than 10 minutes.

We propose a one-time annual fee paid by The River to Grand Traverse County in an increasing 3-year lease format:

After year three, we propose an evaluation of services, and the first rights to continue the lease at the year three rental amount for an additional three years.

At the end of each season, we will provide a written report of our activities for the year, including any issues or problems we encounter. This will be in the form of a letter hand-delivered to the Parks and Recreation offices. We will set the deadline and have the report for review by October 31st of each year

# Agreement Between: The Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation Commission and the River Outfitters

This Agreement is entered into on June 1, 2016, between Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation Commission (hereinafter referred to as the "Parks and Recreation Commission"), 1213 W. Civic Center Drive, Traverse City, Michigan 49686, and the River Outfitters, 221 W. Grandview Parkway, Traverse City, Michigan 49684.

The Parks and Recreation Commission enters into this Agreement with the River Outfitters so
that River Outfitters may provide recreation and light concessions services, which are further
described in this Agreement on the grounds, identified in Appendix A which is attached to this
Agreement and incorporate by reference, at Medalie Roadside Park. Medalie Roadside Park
property and its facilities are owned and operated by Grand Traverse County, and located at
1910 W. South Airport Road, Traverse City, Michigan 49686.

# 2. General Description

Medalie Roadside Park is a 15 acre public park, featuring a picnic shelter, indoor restrooms, a paved walking path, three overlooks/platforms, and a canoe launch site. The park is located on the south shore of the Boardman Lake, along the Boardman River, and is intersected by the TART Trail. The legal description of Medalie Roadside Park is:

- 3. The intent of this Agreement is for the River Outfitters to lease designated space at Medalie Roadside Park so that River Outfitters may provide offer recreational and concession services to the public. River Outfitters agrees to provide the following services:
  - kayak rentals;
  - bike rentals;
  - standup paddleboard rentals (SUPs);
  - "shuttle" service to other locations;
  - on-site bike repair;
  - minimal concession sales such as water, sports drinks, snacks, with the possibility for expanding concessions products to be approved by Director of the Parks and Recreation Department before sales commence as further set forth in this Agreement;
  - hosting events at the pavilion located at Medalie Roadside Park by reserving the pavilion ahead of time, following Parks and Recreation Department reservation procedures.

# 4. Length of Contract

The terms of this contract shall be for three months, June 1 through August 31, 2016, with an option for the River Outfitters to extend operation dates through September 2016 or through October 2016 with fourteen days (14 days) prior notice by the River Outfitters to the Director of the Parks and Recreation Director who may approve or disapprove the extension within the Director's sole discretion. This Agreement also may be renewed for an addition term or terms by mutual agreement of the Parties.

#### 5. Evaluation

At the end of the contract term, River Outfitters agrees to provide the Parks and Recreation Commission with a written evaluation of the number of participants served, items sold, and level of customer satisfaction with services being provided. River Outfitters also agrees to prepare a written report of its earnings of its operation at Medalie Roadside Park and to meet with the Parks and Recreation Department Director to discuss its operation at Medalie Roadside Park.

# 6. Facilities and Equipment

River Outfitters will use kayaks/bikes/SUPs as signage at the entrance of the park within 50 feet of the park sign. All signage must be compliant with local ordinances. A trailer may be used, if approved by the Grand Traverse County Facilities Management Grounds Coordinator and Parks and Recreation Commission. River Outfitters will use canoe launch and the inlet/outlet to the immediate south of launch to launch canoes, kayaks, and standup paddle boards. River Outfitters will be mindful of and monitor launch area for signs of erosion and immediately report such to the Parks and Recreation Director. River Outfitters shall be solely responsible for all equipment used in providing the services provided in the above Paragraph 3 of this Agreement.

# 7. Assumption of Risk and Insurance

River Outfitters assumes all risk in performing work and services under this Agreement, and shall be solely responsible for any and all damages arising out of injuries to persons or property. River Outfitters shall maintain, at its own expense, liability insurance coverage for all operations, products, use, and/or occupancy of the property, including bodily injury and death. Minimum limit of liability is \$2,000,000 in combined single limit, bodily injury, and property damage coverage, per occurrence, and aggregate. River Outfitters shall provide satisfactory certificates of all insurance policies to the Parks and Recreation Commission prior to commencing any use or occupancy of the Premises. It is agreed that thirty (30) days' advance written notice of cancellation, non-renewal, reduction, and/or material change in coverage, and ten (10) days' advance written notice for non-payment of premium will be mailed to the Parks and Recreation Commission at the address noted in the "Notice" section of this agreement.

River Outfitters shall also provide proof of Workman's Compensation Insurance for all of its employees. All employees of the River Outfitters working at Medalie Roadside Park must be at least 16 years of age. All employees must be CPR-First-aid Certified. All employees, even though they are agents of the River Outfitters, and not Grand Traverse County, shall conduct themselves in a professional manner so as not to cast a negative image upon the Parks and Recreation Commission.

#### 8. Waiver

River Outfitters shall have all of its customers who use its services and rent its equipment at Medalie Roadside Park execute a waiver of liability releasing Grand Traverse County, its officials, agents, volunteers and employees from liability that may arise from the services River Outfitters will provide to the public at Medalie Roadside Park. River Outfitters agrees to provide to the Parks and Recreation Director a copy of the customer waiver for review prior to providing services, and agrees to revise the waiver, if requested by the Director. after consultation with the County's Civil Counsel and Grand Traverse County's insurance provider, Michigan Municipal Risk Management Association.

# 9. Food Handling Equipment Responsibilities

The River Outfitters will obtain any necessary licenses or certifications, as required by state and local laws, to provide concessions, and to meet or exceed the minimum standards required by the local Health Department.

# 10. Suggested Food and Beverages

All food and beverage items to be sold by River Outfitters must be approved by the Parks and Recreation Director. All prices of foods served by the River Outfitters must be approved by the Parks and Recreation Director. The River Outfitters is strictly limited to selling only food products. At no time will the sale of non-food items be permitted, unless with written approval of the Director.

# 11. Parks and Recreation Commission Obligations

The Parks and Recreation Commission agrees, as follows:

- A. Premises. Except as otherwise provided in this agreement, the Parks and Recreation Commission shall make available the grounds identified in Appendix A for the scheduled number of days and times.
- B. Maintenance of Premises. The Parks Commission shall work with the Grand Traverse County Facilities Management Department to maintain the grounds identified in Appendix A in good repair.
- C. Parks and Recreation Department Director. The Parks and Recreation Department Director shall be the immediate contact for all issues concerning this Agreement.

# 12. Financial Responsibility of the River Outfitters

The River Outfitters shall pay Parks and Recreation a sum of \$1,500.00 for rental of space at the grounds identified in Appendix A for its shed and equipment at Medalie Park through the end date of contract, with payment to be made on the date agreement is signed.

River Outfitters further agrees to pay Parks and Recreation a sum of \$500 for storage of its shed only at Medalie Roadside Park, in an area to be identified by County Parks Director and Facilities Management Grounds Coordinator, with payment to be made on the date agreement is signed. River Outfitters shall move shed at its own expense.

If River Outfitters conducts large events in accordance with this Agreement, it will share a percentage of sales with the Parks and Recreation Commission for each event conducted, as agreed to by both Parties. If concessions beyond water and snacks are implemented, River Outfitters will share a percentage of those sales with the Parks and Recreation Commission, as agreed to by both Parties.

# 13. Exclusiveness of River Outfitters

River Outfitters acknowledges that the Parks and Recreation Commission cannot guarantee that the River Outfitters will have exclusive rights to sell food at Medalie Roadside Park. The Parks and Recreation Director may give a user group permission to sell food for an event to be held at Medalie Roadside Park. The Director will meet with the River Outfitters prior to the event to discuss the event details.

#### 14. Hold Harmless

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the River Outfitters agrees to defend, pay on behalf of, indemnify, and hold harmless the Grand Traverse County and its Parks and Recreation Commission, its elected and appointed officials, employees and volunteers, and others working on behalf of Grand Traverse County or it Parks and Recreation Commission, against any and all claims, demands, suits, or loss, including all costs connected therewith, and for any damages which may be asserted, claimed, or recovered against or from Grand Traverse County or the Parks and Recreation Commission, by reason of personal injury, including bodily injury or death and/or property damage, including loss of use thereof, which arises out of, or is in any way connected or associated with this agreement.

# 15. Force Majeure

The parties are not liable for failure to perform any obligation owed under this agreement if that failure is a result of an Act of God (e.g. fire, flood, and other natural disaster), war, government sanction, labor dispute, utility failure, or similar circumstance.

# 16. Non-exclusive Use of Park

River Outfitters shall make all reasonable efforts not to interfere with the use and enjoyment of common areas and non-leased areas of the facilities and grounds by the public or other user groups.

# 17. No Third Party Vendors

Parks and Recreation Commission shall neither solicit nor encourage any person or group who is not a party to this contract to engage in the sale of any goods, services, or promotions during the term of this lease, unless permitted by the Director.

# 18. Dispute Resolution

If there is any question or dispute between the Parties regarding the terms and conditions of this agreement, or the application of those terms and conditions, River Outfitters shall be represented by its program manager and two members of its board or, if no board, two persons actively involved in administering River Outfitters' organization, and the Parks and Recreation Commission shall be represented by its Director and two Commissioners. Failure to engage in discussions under this section shall itself be deemed a breach of this Agreement. Both Parties shall use best efforts to reach agreement in order to accomplish the objective of this agreement.

# 19. Assignment

River Outfitters shall not assign any right or interest in this agreement without the express, written consent of the Parks and Recreation Commission.

# 20. Destruction of Premises

If the premises shall be rendered unusable by fire or other casualty, the Parks and Recreation Commission shall make the premises usable as speedily as possible, and the fees charged to River Outfitters shall be suspended for each day the premises are unusable.

# 21. Default

This Agreement is granted on the condition that if, an event of default shall occur and then a default occurs, this Agreement may be terminated. An event of default shall occur if there has been: (1) a failure by River Outfitters to pay, when due, any amount to be paid to the Parks and

Recreation Commission; (2) a failure by River Outfitters to obtain any policy of insurance or to pay any insurance premiums required by the terms of this Agreement; or (3) a failure by either party to comply with any other obligations or provisions of this Agreement. Following an event of default, either Party may send notice to the other of the event of default. The notice shall provide the breaching Party thirty (30) days to cure the default. In the event a default is not cured during the notice period then, upon the expiration of that period of thirty (30) days, a default shall exist. Causing default with the express purpose of terminating this agreement shall not deny the other party of any remedies available by law.

#### 22. Remedies

If a default as defined above occurs, then the non-breaching Party shall, at its election, upon or concurrent with the giving of notice, have the right to terminate this Agreement and enforce remedies available pursuant to Michigan law.

# 23. Notices

All notices under this agreement shall be in writing and be sent by certified mail, addressed to the persons at the addresses indicated below, or at such other address as either party shall designate, in writing. A change in address may be effected by a certified letter sent by either party to the other. Unless the Parks and Recreation Commission gives notice to the contrary, all payments to the Parks and Recreation Commission under the terms of this agreement shall be made to the Parks and Recreation Commission at the address for the Parks and Recreation Commission set forth above.

24. No modification, alteration, or amendment to this Agreement shall be binding, unless in writing and signed by both parties to the agreement.

# 25. Rules and Regulations

River Outfitters shall follow all rules and regulations of the Parks and Recreation Commission (see Appendix B), and assist in enforcement of those rules and regulations as they pertain to all of its players, parents, spectators, coaches, administrators, and others associated with the program.

# 26. Other Laws and Regulations

River Outfitters shall comply with all laws and regulations, municipal, state, and federal now in force or which may become effective during the term of this agreement.

# 27. Alterations or Improvements

River Outfitters shall make no alteration or improvements to the premises without the prior written approval of the Parks and Recreation Commission. This includes the placement of any fastener (e.g., nail, screw, lag bolt, etc.) to any wall, floor, or ceiling.

# 28. Damages

River Outfitters shall return Premises at the end of each use and at the end of the term of this agreement in its original condition prior to the beginning of the term of this agreement, except for normal wear and tear. River Outfitters agrees to pay all damages to the Premises, occasioned by River Outfitters' use of the property, including that of its participants, volunteers, employees, spectators or others associated with the program.

# 29. Whole Agreement

This agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the Parties, and shall be deemed to supersede and cancel any other Agreement between the Parties relating to the transactions contemplated in this Agreement. None of the previous and contemporaneous negotiations, preliminary drafts, or previous versions of this agreement leading up to its execution and not set forth in this Agreement shall be used by any of the parties to construe or affect the validity of this agreement. Each party acknowledges that no representation, inducement, or condition not set forth in this agreement has been made or relied on by either party.

# 30. Severability

If any provision in this agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable, it shall be ineffective only to the extent of the invalidity, without affecting or impairing the validity and enforceability of the remainder of the provision or the remaining provisions of this Agreement.

# 31. No Third Party Beneficiaries

The parties do not intend to confer any benefits on any person, firm, or corporation other than River Outfitters and the Parks and Recreation Commission.

# 32. No Waiver

The failure of either party to enforce any covenant or condition of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of that covenant or condition or of the right of either party to enforce each and every covenant and condition of this agreement. No provision of this Agreement shall be deemed to have been waived unless the waiver is in writing and signed by the party against whom the waiver is to be enforced.

# 33. Americans with Disabilities Act

Parks and Recreation Commission shall comply in all respects with Title III (public accommodations) of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

# 34. Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan.

#### 35. Venue

By execution of this Agreement, the parties consent to venue in Grand Traverse County of any action brought to enforce the terms of this agreement or to collect any monies due under it.

#### 36. Effective Date

The parties have signed this agreement in duplicate, and it shall be effective as of the day and year indicated in the opening paragraph.



#### 37. Contract Termination

The Parks and Recreation Commission reserves the right to terminate this Agreement under the following situations:

- A. if the River Outfitters fails to carry the proper insurance, certificates, etc., listed above in this document;
- B. if the River Outfitters fails to meet the rules and regulations of the Health Department;
- C. if the Parks and Recreation Commission finds it necessary to terminate for convenience, the contract shall be terminated with two (2) weeks' written notice to the River Outfitters.

# Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation Commission Rules Amended April 16, 2015

The following rules are promulgated by the Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation Commission by authority conferred on the Commission by Act 261 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan of 1965, MCL § 46.364, as amended, for the protection, regulation and control of its facilities and areas, and with the approval of the Grand Traverse County Board of Commissioners.

# Section 1. Definitions.

- a. "Commission" shall mean the Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation Commission.
- b. "County Park Property" shall mean all lands, waters and property administered by or under the jurisdiction of the Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation Commission.
- c. "Director" shall mean the Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation Director.
- d. "Person" or "persons" shall mean individuals, firms, corporations, or any group or gathering of individuals.
- e. "Camping" means the overnight lodging or sleeping of a person or persons in a tent, trailer-coach, vehicle camper, motor vehicle, or in any other conveyance erected, parked or placed on the premises.
- Section 2. Unlawful acts generally. On lands owned or under the control of the department, it is unlawful for a person or persons to do any of the following:
  - 1. To enter, use, or occupy County Park Property for any purpose when they are posted against entry, use, or occupancy, as ordered by the commission.

- 2. To dispose of refuse, rubbish, trash, or garbage not resulting from the use of county-owned lands in receptacles provided on Commission property.
- 3. To ignite any fire except within fireplaces, receptacles or open spaces designated and approved for such purposes by the Director.
- 4. To place or burn garbage within a designated fireplace, receptacle or open space designated and approved for the building of fires by the Director, or bury refuse, rubbish, trash, or garbage, regardless of its origin.
- 5. To use tobacco or smoke at the Grand Traverse County Civic Center. As used in this rule, the word "smoke" means any of the following:
  - (a) using a cigarette, e-cigarette, cigar, pipe or vapors-tanks-mods or related product that contains tobacco, nicotine or any other related product that is lighted, burning or heated;
  - (b) lighting a cigarette, e-cigarette, cigar, pipe or vapors-tanks-mods or related product that contains tobacco, nicotine or any other related product;
  - (c) exhaling smoke or vapor from burning or heating tobacco, nicotine, or any other related product that is contained in a cigarette, e-cigarette, cigar, pipe or vapors-tanksmods or related product.
- 6. To cause a noise disturbance, which is defined as sound created by human activity with or without the use of any device, which by reason of its volume, intensity, location, or time of day impairs the health, welfare, or peace of another person of normal human sensibilities. The following acts and activities are declared to be noise disturbances and are prohibited. This enumeration shall not be deemed exclusive.
  - a. The playing of any radio, television, phonograph, other sound reproduction device, or musical instrument in such a manner or at such a volume as to be sufficiently audible to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of persons in the vicinity.
  - b. The keeping of any animal or bird which, by causing frequent or long continued noise, shall disturb the comfort and repose of any person in the vicinity.
  - c. The use of any motor vehicle, in such a manner as to create a disturbing noise, including, but not limited to, the screeching of tires and the discharge into the open air of exhaust from the engine without a sufficient muffler.
  - d. Shouting or other raucous or boisterous behavior for an unreasonable length of time.

- e. The use of a loudspeaker, public address system without a permit issued by the Director.
- f. On the Meadows Trail at the VASA Trailhead Property, on lands owned and under the control of the department it is unlawful for a person or persons to do any of the following:
  - 1. To operate an off-the-road motor-driven vehicle such as a minibike, motorcycle, dunemobile, snowmobile, converted snowmobile, amphibious vehicle, or any other motorized device, except on designated roads, trails, or areas posted for such use without proper written permission.
- 7. To place or erect a fence or barrier, to construct or occupy improvements, or to enclose the lands or obstruct the passage of another person or persons in any way from entering, exiting or using County Park Property without permission of the Director.
- 8. To peddle or systematically solicit business of any nature; distribute or post any handbills or other advertising matter or post signs without permission from the Director.
- 9. To paint, mark, or otherwise apply any chemical or **harmful** substance on any tree, rock, or any other land, water, structure or property without the permission from the Director.
- 10. To park vehicles of any type in areas posted as no parking; or, where designated parking areas exist, to park vehicles of any type in an area other than the designated parking area. If a motor vehicle is found parked on County Park Property, then the license plate displayed on the motor vehicle shall constitute prima facie evidence that the person who parked it there is the owner of the vehicle.
- 11. To camp on County Park Property unless approved and designated for such purposes by the Director and with an approved permit issued by the Director.
- 12. To store or leave property on county lands for more than 24 hours without written permission of the Director. This subdivision does not apply to lawfully occupied, designated camping sites when camping with a permit authorized by the Director.
- 13. To ride or lead a horse, pack animal, or other riding animal, or any animal driven vehicle on any area, except on roads that are open to the use of motor vehicles, trails, bridle paths, and campgrounds designated for such use by the Director.
- 14. To possess a dog without a leash or on a leash greater than six-foot in length except upon County Park Property open to hunting.

- 15. To enter or remain on County Park Property between the hours of 11:00 pm and 6:00 am unless the property is open for events between these hours.
- 16. To possess a firearm, bow and arrow, crossbow, trap or other instrument used for hunting or trapping of animals; or to hunt or trap on any County Park Property unless that property is open to hunting and/or trapping by Rule of the Commission.
- 17. To possess, consume, or offer for sale alcoholic beverages except in locations approved for such by the parks and recreation commission.
- 18. To refuse to comply with the above rules upon the demand of an authorized local enforcement officer; or to interfere with the officer's enforcement of the ordinance; or to retaliate against another who has made complaint of a violation of a park rule; or to interfere with an employee or agent of the Grand Traverse County Parks and Recreation Department while performing his or her official duties.
- Section 3. Enforcement Officers. The Grand Traverse County Sheriff and deputies are authorized as local enforcement officers of this ordinance.
- Section 4. Fines and Imprisonment. Any person violating any provision of the foregoing rules shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than \$100 and costs of prosecution, or imprisoned in the Grand Traverse County Jail for a period not exceeding 90 days or both, for each offense.
- Section 5. Compliance with Other Laws. Nothing in this ordinance impairs or precludes a separate cause of action provided by statute or common law for conduct prohibited herein.
- Section 6. Severability. The provisions of this ordinance are severable and if any part is declared void or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining parts shall remain in force.
